Club of the Year

Award

Sodbury Tennis Club won this award. The club has close to 400 social and playing members but only four courts and the committee, coaching and court maintenance teams work tirelessly to ensure the facilities are kept in good shape and available for all.



Coach of the Year Award

Andy Gray from Saltford Tennis Club was named Coach of the Year. Andy joined Saltford two years ago and has built up a full programme from scratch. He now coaches 120 players aged from four to 80 including walking tennis and sessions for neurodiverse and disabled children. Lewis Fishlock from David Lloyd Emersons Green was highly commended in this category.







Competition of the Year Award

The Competition of the Year Award went to **Sodbury Tennis Club's Competition Team**.

The team runs multiple competitions throughout the year from charity and fun events through to box leagues, walking tennis and the annual club championships.
